NICKELS FOR NON-PROFITS AT WHOLE FOODS FOLSOM TEAMS WITH P.A.R.T.Y.

Every four months, the staff at Whole Foods Market in Folsom choose two non-profit organizations among whom to divide the proceeds of their nickels for non-profits program. Now through April 16th, customers are invited to bring reusable grocery bags for new purchases and to allocate the \$.05 rebate to P.A.R.T.Y. (Prevent Alcohol and Risk Related Trauma in Youth) to raise awareness and funds for the cause as well as promote green living. Store Marketing Team Leader, Ciara Glass, explained that they chose to promote P.A.R.T.Y. because they feel strongly about helping make the community safer for everyone. Donations raised will help continue to fund the programs that seek to keep the dangers of driving distracted, drowsy or under the influence fresh in the minds of teens as well as their parents. P.A.R.T.Y. programs are currently taking place with Folsom, Vista, Oak Ridge, Rosville, Granite Bay and El Dorado High Schools and plans are being made for expansion. A shortage of funding is all that keeps coordinators from starting more programs.
